Former Director of the School of Art History at Iberoamericana University, and the Institute for Aesthetics Research at the Mexico National Autonomous University (UNAM). Member of Mexico Arts Academy since 1980; former President and current Vice-President of the International History of Art Academy since 1979. Founder and former President of the History of Art Mexican Committee. She published over 120 articles and participated in more than 40 conferences and 150 lectures worldwide.
