CONFERENCE HEADQUARTERS

THE PLAZA HOTEL

The Plaza Hotel is a new hotel on the road into Palenque before you come to the turnoff to La Canada. It is owned by Chiapanecans who are very interested in building a fine reputation for repeat business. All of our dealings with them have been extraordinary. There is a swimming pool, dining space, lovely rooms and an ideal place for the conference meetings. The PLAZA has 90 rooms, all air conditioned,16 rms. with king size bed, all others have 2 double beds. No triple rooms. Buffet breakfast will be served to Conference participants.

OTHER HOTELS BEING USED

These are all located close together and will make it a lot easier for participants in the Mesa Redonda.

THE HOTEL TUCON is across the roads from The Plaza. It also is a lovely hotel with beautiful grounds, a lovely swimming pool and dining room. The TUCON has 56 rooms, 6 with 1 king size bed, all others have 2 double beds, all air conditioned. A few suites. No

triple rooms. Buffet breakfast will be served to Conference participants .

TULIPANES Hotel is at the entrance to La Canada. Key Sanchez had done a lot of building with a number of new rooms and a nice small swimming pool with nice deck with chairs and tables. 36 rooms. All have air conditioning. 16 are new, some triple. After the first 16 rooms are reserved, the remainder will vary in quality. Buffet breakfast will be served to Conference participants.

HOTEL RESERVED FOR STUDENTS Clean, very basic, directly across from the Tucon, inexpensive.

All Mesa Redonda participants are to register for their preferred hotel on the enclosed REGISTRATION FORM. You are not to make your own reservations as these hotels are completely booked for this registration.

AMERICAN AIRLINES, the OFFICIAL AIRLINE FOR THE MESA REDONDA

American Airlines has reserved enough seats on their carriers to get our large group to the 20th Anniversary Conference. This is the only airline we were able to negotiate this with. Those of you who travel much, know how difficult it is to get a ticket at exactly the time you want it. Mexicana has reserved seats for our group also, as all of you know how difficult it can be getting from Mexico City to Villahermosa.

American Airlines is giving us 2 free Raffle Prizes which will be drawn at the Mesa Redonda by all participants who came on American and purchased their tickets through Travelfax. The Travelfax number is on the registration form.

Each prize is 2 free round trip tickets anywhere American flies in the Continental United States, the Caribbean, Mexico or Hawaii.

THAN FEB. 1, 1993

Do NOT send your abstracts or papers to PARI.

You will be notified if your paper has been selected to deliver at the Mesa Redonda. Abstracts will not be returned.

If your paper is selected, it must be submitted, ready for publication to Victoria Bricker in New Orleans **BEFORE** the MESA REDONDA.

- You are responsible for having your own paper edited.
- 2. Papers are to be no longer than twelve 8 1/2" x 11" printed pages in the book, including illustrations and bibliography. (See past Palenque Round Table Series).

Your paper should be on a MacIntosh diskett, Helvetica type, font size 10. Be sure and leave the appropriate spaces for your illustrations.

4. Send in one diskett with your text and 1 excellent copy and one second copy for marking up. if necessary.

5 Margins must be:

Left 3/4", Right 1 1/8", Top 7/8", Bottom 1 1/4"

Title page top margin 3 1/2" your name goes in this space and under your name goes your school or affiliation.

6. Ilustrations must be:

 camera ready on glossy stock.in your paper. Do not cut them with scissors. If they are to be cropped, the printer will crop them.
 identified on the back in pencil.

4. The printed pages you are submitting are to have the blank spaces left where the illustration will go.

YOU MUST COMPLY WITH THE ABOVE.

To mail, put heavy cardboard on top and bottom larger than the sheets to keep paper from getting damaged on edges.
